



Coleman Memorial Bible College Scholarships

Scholarship recipients are selected from those who have demonstrated a servant's heart in their local church or from those in a Northwest summer internship program. Scholarships are subject to the Scholarship Committee's determination by considering the following criteria: personal testimony, listed involvements of their serving their Lord and pastoral recommendation of God's hand on applicant's life. Further consideration is given to those coming from the Northwest or being involved in a summer internship program with a church associated with Camp Northwest.

Scholarship Applications may be made to the Coleman Memorial Bible College Scholarship fund, 1310 Echo Hollow Rd. Eugene, OR 97402 from January 1st for the coming school year. Those awarded scholarships may submit a written request for future scholarships by updating the committee of their need and how the Lord has been working in their life. These letters can be sent in after January 1st for the coming school year. We would hope that you would let us know how the Lord continues to work in your life. There is such a treasure in knowing the blessings of the Lord.
